### WORONORA HEIGHTS ESTATE ENTRY STRUCTURE UP- GRADE.

In response to community feedback and through continued discussions with Council, since 2010, the WHRA are proposing to upgrade the very popular Community Notice Board, which welcomes residents and visitors on entering the estate on Bundanoon Road. Through the next coming weeks the association will be submitting to council and our 3 D-Ward Councillors, illustrations and information to obtain the necessary approvals for the construction of the 'New Community Notice Board' (see design on back page). Since the development of Woronora Heights, the residents of the estate have become big users of the notice board. Utilised for general information, welcoming and farewelling family or friends, announcements for special occasions, lost or found and sporting events. The community notice board has served the community well over the years and the time for a new and improved model is needed. Local residents support a new structure to be built that will reflect our estates maturity and pride for those living in Woronora Heights or visiting our great suburb.

#### The New Community Notice Board specification are:

- The base to be constructed of brick and stone cladding approximately 740mm high X 3.4m in length
- The notice board is proposed to stand from the base 3m high for double sided usage, and the frame of the notice board will be constructed of metal piping as the structure.
- Black board surface, double sided.
- The Community Notice Board will provide space for the use of banners or corflu signs. They can be either used for the display of a banner size of 1800mm or 2 banners at 900mm each double sided or singular sided.
- elegant and modern looking design in our shire colors.

### IMPROVEMENTS TO WORONORA HEIGHTS.

In the last few years the WHRA has been busy approaching council to encourage greater support from council in maintaining our suburb's standards. The following has been undertaken to date by council:

- On-going general clean up around the estate, especially around bush land areas. This is an ongoing process with our council ensuring regular cleaning is undertaken. This is a consistent exercise of communication between the association and council.
- Since 2010 encouraged pruning and general clean up along Bundanoon Road.
- At the bottom of Bundanoon Rd, and the entrance to the fire trail, traffic signage improvements and road markings(delineations) have been undertaken. Also the repair and the removal of damaged guard rails which were a safety hazzed to the general public.

## OTHER ISSUES

The WHRA IS ALSO PLANING TO APPROCH COUNCIL ON THE FOLLOWING AREA's OF CONCERN THAT NEED ATTENTION.

- The park at Albatross Rd, was once a place used by young children to play, now for some years has been abandoned with over growth. The need to clean up and cut back the undergrowth is urgently required.
- At Goshawk Crs the treated pine logs used as barriers need replacement or removal they have become damaged or deteriorated due to weathering.
- Ongoing action to the improvement of our footpaths around the estate. Council commenced a program to resurface and upgrade footpaths but this has slowed right down. A lot of work is still needed to be done, especially uneven footpaths which are a hazed to public safety.
